



## Warner Amazon Expedition 2009 & 2010 Probability Table – 15<sup>th</sup> November 2009

We think it may help those involved by summarising what we think are the deliverables and risks associated with the project.

The table below outlines key deliverables but by know means is exhaustive.

Deliverable	Probability
The most intriguing giant snake / dinosaur hunt documentary ever filmed	100%
A fascinating human interest story & travelogue	100%
A back story that intrigued millions around the world	100%
The revealing of a secret surrounding a 'giant' snake that appears in the art, written accounts & folklore of cultures around the world & throughout time	100%
The most extensive archive of scientific, photographic & zoological data collected that all points to the existence of this snake today in the Peruvian Amazon	100%
Site 1 where a snake of monstrous proportions has existed for many years	100%
Site 2 within a few kilometres where hundreds of people witnessed a giant snake crash out of the jungle in 1997	100%
Site 3 where a community witnessed a giant snake destroy a 'floating' house in June 2009	100%
Site 4 The re-discovery of an extraordinary thermal lake where a living dinosaur was witnessed & reported by Franz Herman Schmidt & Rudolf Pfleng in 1907	100%
Site 5 where a recent report suggests a snake in excess of 30M in length with ribs c.1M died during a geological survey (using dynamite) and can be excavated for physical & DNA evidence with living eye-witnesses (tribal elders)	95%
Governmental and municipal authority support in UK & Peru	95%
Locate & record the Bora Tribe for ritual 'snake dance'	95%
Scientific collaborators Canada, UK, S. America, USA	90%
Photographic evidence of tracks & contemporaneous descriptions	75%



Deliverable	Probability
Collection of DNA samples (including skin, bone, teeth, mucous, faeces) for scientific identification of species	60%
Photographic encounter with live specimen	50%
Death or injury: Our primary concern will be achieving all of the above in a safe environment through detailed planning but we have not been able to mitigate against all risk. This will, at times, be a risky & possibly dangerous exercise for the ground crew.	c. 15%
A story of global human & scientific interest following a conclusive discovery	100%

The snake that the Warner Amazon Expedition will reveal is the same snake features briefly in many of the current films and documentaries surrounding the 2012 Mayan prophecies.

However, although these programmes make reference to the snake in their programming, it is clear that there is little understanding of its true nature.

This programme & expedition can reveal a whole new aspect to the evidence and theories being televised (and no doubt) scheduled over the coming year. Indeed the world cultures, past & present are united in their belief of the existence of this giant snake known in the Peruvian Amazon as Yacumama or the Black Boa.
